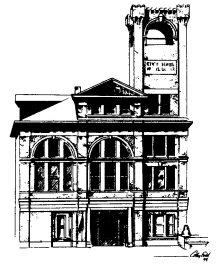


# City of Winchester

To the Citizens of Winchester, Kentucky:

The Kentucky Department for Local Government (DLG) is accepting application material under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Disaster Recovery Program. The City of Winchester intends to apply for assistance for four culvert replacements/restorations. The purpose of this notice is to obtain views on housing and community development needs, review proposed activities, review the proposed application, and solicit public comments. Technical assistance is available to help groups representing low and moderate income persons in developing these proposals.

The following information concerning the CDBG Program is available for public inspection in the City Manager's Office at City Hall during regular business hours:

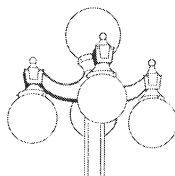
- Amount of funds available and range of activities that may be undertaken.
- Estimated amounts of funds proposed to be used for activities benefiting persons on low and moderate incomes.
- Plans for minimizing displacement of persons as a result of activities associated with CDBG funds and plans for providing assistance to those persons to be actually displaced as a result of CDBG-funded activities.
- Records regarding the past use of CDBG funds.
- A summary of other important program requirements.

## Comments on Application

A copy of the CDBG application material will be on file in the City Manager's Office of City Hall, 32 Wall Street, Winchester, Kentucky for citizens' review and comment during regular business hours from August 5, 2011 through August 12, 2011. Comments on the proposed application may be submitted to the attention of Mayor Ed Burtner or Mr. Ken Kerns, City Manager until the close of business on August 12, 2011.
